









Ma-SHIP Final Project report launch at the 10th GRIHA Summit

11 December 2018, New Delhi, India

The culmination of the Mainstreaming Sustainable Social Housing in India Project (MaS-SHIP) was marked by the launch of the Final project report at the 10th GRIHA summit, on 11 December 2018 at India Habitat Center, New Delhi. A special session was organised by the MaS-SHIP team during the summit to launch the report and present the key findings from the project.

The report was formally released by Dr. Shailesh K. Agrawal, from Building Materials and Technology Promotion Council (BMTPC) India, Sanjay Seth from TERI and Zeenat Niazi from Development Alternatives (DA).

Megha Behal from TERI provided the background and introduction to the project and the various outputs of the research. She introduced the final report and outlined its contents that included background and insights on the selection of attributes for assessing sustainability performance of building systems, characterising sustainability performance of selected building systems, findings on residents' experience of building systems and living conditions in social housing developments and tools and policy briefings that have been developed through the research, with an aim to mainstream the integration of sustainable building materials and practices in social housing.

The report was well received by the audiences and the participating organizations expressed their interest and appreciation for the work done in the project.
